Water-based spray is now made with a sunflower-honeysuckle preservative system:

- Before outdoor adventures, spray several mists onto your hands & massage dog's outer ears, back of head, abdomen, legs & tail; repeat as needed, especially if the dog gets wet
- Spray surrounding play areas & bedding; repeat as needed
- After your adventure has ended, spray irritated skin, and repeat as needed
- Choose the 2 oz. bottle for travel, and the 8 oz. bottles to use at home, in the kennel or stable

Roll-on base of coconut oil absorbs quickly, doesn't stain or leave sticky residues & has a long shelf-life:

- Before outdoor adventures, roll onto fingertips and apply to ears, legs, tail, chest, muzzle; repeat as needed, especially if the dog gets wet
- After adventures, roll onto irritated skin; reapply as needed
